Veterans helps themselves and the community through new local program

A short road trip is on the summer agenda for several Bellingham Branch members after hearing our February speakers, from Growing Veterans. The road trip goal is a visit to the farm to buy some of the vegetables, because they looked *gorgeous* in the slide show.

Our speakers were Chris Wolf, Operations Manager for the Growing Veterans farm, and Scotty Irwin, a former military medic and new employee at GV. They explained that Growing Veterans is a fairly new organization, started by three-tour combat veteran Chris Brown. Brown started gardening as therapy for his own PTSD, and in conversations with other vets in classes at Huxley College of the Environment, formed the idea of starting a local farm. They wanted a spot where veterans could find meaningful work, begin to reintegrate into civilian life, and reduce the feeling of isolation that is common to vets when they are no longer in their tight-knit military units. One of their goals was to serve as a model

for how farming should be done, with protection of the environment and best practices for growing the most nutritious foods.

A job on a local farm, a fellowship, and help from Growing Washington enabled Brown to take over the lease of the former Bellingham Food Bank farm. In one of those "it was meant to be" events, he was encouraged to talk with Chris Wolf, who had been working on the farm while the food bank ran it. She also has a degree in counseling. The fit was perfect, and farming began in 2013. Both Chris Wolf and Scotty Irwin attested to the value the program has for veterans. The peer support and outdoor work environment are real therapy, plus top-notch produce has been trucked to the farmer's market at the Seattle Veterans' Hospital where most of the customers are veterans or medical personnel. Chris says that if a vet can't afford the produce, it becomes a gift from GV. Produce also is sold to local restaurants.

Both women gave us insights into their personal histories and reasons for joining GV. Chris is a Bellingham native, and Scotty was born and raised in Scotland. Both have had their own battles with PTSD - Chris as the result of a car

accident, and Scotty from years of work as a medic, EMT and police officer. Thus, they both have empathy for returning soldiers.

The program has drawn national interest, with other communities interested in copying the idea. GV has grown enough to add a second rented acreage, Starbird Farm, in the Skagit Valley, and now has 10 employees plus many volunteers. They are now developing peer-topeer support training, to teach vets to be supports for each other.
