



Lynn Bellinger has tendered her resignation as co-membership chairperson, due to recent health problems. We wish you the best, Lynn!


# **Long-time AAUW member** passes away

She was a long time member of AAUW and was a past member of the Bellingham School Board., Her New Yorkers stacked on the table and the many books on her shelf attested to her enduring interest in the world around her. "Knowing Carol was a delight and a privilege. She was my mother's age, but I did not sense the generational difference because she was so engaged and interested in everything and everyone, whether family, friends, community, national or international events.
