If these have been bringing you down, our September 10th speakers will renew your faith in the future, as well as get you thinking about our AAUW mission of education.

Faythe Duran is studying for her master's degree at Western, and she has a compelling story of hard work and determination. When she was 10 years old, her father passed away, leaving her high school educated mother as sole caretaker for Favthe and her brother. "I yearned to explore beyond the horizon, to be a scientist, to experience the world differently from my parents or peers," Faythe writes.

"I began working as a fast food carhop while in high school. I would go to school, followed by soccer or track practice, and then off to Sonic to work until closing at midnight. I would go home, do homework, sleep, and repeat. My hard work paid off: I was able to help financially support my family, break my high school's 400 meter dash record, and win the Dorrance Scholarship.

Arizona with an annual \$10,000 for tuition, well designed summer programs, and travel abroad and professional development stipends. Being selected as a Dorrance Scholar completely changed my life. I graduated from Northern Arizona University, a feat which no other member of my immediate or extended family has accomplished.

"The last semester of my undergraduate career was spent in Ushuaia, Tierra del Fuego, Argentina, as a soil science intern. I gathered baseline soil characteristic data for the new pilot site in Tierra del Fuego, as part of a long term nationwide desertification monitoring initiative. My undergraduate experiences have taught me to work independently as well as collaboratively. By attaining a graduate degree, I aspire to pursue a career in natural resource management and research. This education will be of value to the global scientific community in the coming decades, as climate change becomes an ever more pressing issue... Moreover, I hope to encourage more minority women to chase their educational goals and bring their unique perspectives to the fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics."

Our four Tech Trek scholarship recipients for this past summer will talk about their experiences at the week-long STEM camp at Pacific Lutheran University. They are all beginning eighth grade this school year: Calista Cronck, Mei Li Personius and Jasmine Miller all attend Kulshan Middle School, while Huyen Le attends Fairhaven Middle School.
