AAUW Bellingham and Whatcom LWV to present distinguished guest speaker Jeanne Kohl-Welles

"Women as Political Change Agents" will be the timely topic, in this election year, of King County Councilwoman Jeanne Kohl-Welles, Ph.D., when she addresses a joint meeting of Bellingham Branch - AAUW, and League of Women

Voters of Bellingham/ Whatcom County.

Councilperson Kohl-Welles served in the Washington State Senate from 1994 until she resigned at the end of 2015. Since 1985, she also has taught women's



studies, sociology and education at the University of Washington. She holds a Ph.D. in Sociology of Education from UCLA. She comes to Bellingham under the auspices of the Humanities Washington Speakers Bureau, of which she is a member.

Kohl-Welles will discuss the development of women's leadership roles in politics, in counterpoint to male leadership roles, and engage the audience in a discussion of how to increase representation of women and women of color in politics today.

The meeting begins at 10 a.m. The library is located at 210 Central Avenue in Bellingham, and the meeting room is downstairs. The most direct access is from the side facing City Hall, but those needing handicapped access may use the front entrance and the elevator. Coffee and cookies will be served.
